### **1. Call to Order**

The meeting was called to order at 5:30 p.m.

### **2. Welcome & Introduction of New Member – Peter Davis and ChristineJohnson**

Christine Johnson introduced herself.

### **3. Approval of the Agenda**

Carol Velasques Richardson made a motion to approve the agenda as presented; Lucia Curta second; unanimous approval; motion carried.

### **4. Approval of Minutes**

Carol Velasques Richardson made a motion to approve the March 6 minutes as presented; Queenchiku Ngozi second; unanimous approval; motion carried.

### **5. May 5, 2023 Artists Conference Discussion**

The Artist Conference is next month. Gina Peebles requested members to submit their registration form, if they haven't already done so. To date, we have 11 people registered. The Council agreed to cancel their May 1 meeting since the Artist Conference is later that same week.

### **6. Arts & Economic Prosperity 6 Study Update**

To date, we've received 597 surveys, 74.6% of our 800 survey goal. There are a few events scheduled in April and surveys are being collected.

### **7. Call-to-Artists Ranking**

A total of 51 submittals were ranked. Chelsea Carnes made a motion to select Mauricio Ramirez, Koz Does, and Thomas Agran & Drew Etienne as the top three ranked artists for the Court Services Building mural; Lucia Curta second; unanimous approval; motion carried.

Leira Cruz Caliz offered to provide a demo of Open Gov for future Call to Artists at our June meeting.

## **8. Call-to-Artist Update**

### **8.1 Court Services Building Stained Glass**

Sketches from two of the three top ranked artists have been received. Milligan Studio sent a sample of their proposal entitled "Justice" which was shared with the Council.

### **8.2 Fire Station 21 and 80 Bronze Sculptures**

Sketches were requested from the top three ranked artists. Once received, they will be sent to the County Commission for consideration.

### **8.3 West Lawn Sculpture**

The Sankofa sculpture has been to the foundry and building permits for the pedestal base are being pulled. We are still on target for a June 19th unveiling.

### **8.4 Sports Event Center Mural**

The Sports Event Center mural artist is expected to be complete by Tuesday of next week.

### **8.5 Sports Event Center Sculpture**

The Sports Event Center sculpture is expected to be complete in time for the ribbon cutting ceremony on June 10.

### **8.6 Sports Event Center Silhouettes**

The Silhouettes are complete and will be delivered on Wednesday of this week. They will be glued to the exterior of the building so as not to void the warranty.

## **9. \$10,000 Regrant Opportunity from Visit Gainesville, Alachua County**

Gina Peebles shared the current Arts, Nature, Culture (Destination Enhancement) rubric via email with the Council. The consensus was to apply this

funding toward our existing Art Tag grant since there are many quality applications that are not funded.

**10. Local Support Grant – Dr. Queenchiku Ngozi**

The consensus was to ask the county's grant writer to apply for a Local Support Grant from the State of Florida to create a hub for general program support, networking, Lunch n Learn, and events to support local artists/artist groups.

**11. Public Comment**

Corey Williams was recently awarded a Florida Alliance for Arts Education for community volunteer service.

Poetic Kilns will be held on April 16 from 7-9 p.m. at the Cotton Club.

**Matching Grants to Small Cities for Art Projects (max. \$3,000 – 50% match required)**

The Alachua County Mini or Matching Grant will provide funding for Alachua County artists or small cities for: visual art supplies, music supplies, advertising, studio time, printing, costumes, equipment, and other project-related expenses. Alachua County individual artists, artist collaborators, and not-for-profit organizations are eligible to apply.

**Please Note:** The purpose of these grants are to provide financial support to Alachua County resident artists and the cities of Alachua, Archer, Hawthorne, High Springs, LaCrosse, Micanopy, Newberry and Waldo for public art projects.

## Eligibility

If an Artist, the applicant may only apply for Mini Grants only and must:

- Be a resident of Alachua County, Florida
- Be a US Citizen
- Be 18 years or older
- Not be a current high school or undergraduate student
- Not have been a previous grant recipient

The cities of Alachua, Archer, Hawthorne, High Springs, LaCrosse, Micanopy, Newberry or Waldo are eligible to apply for Matching Grants only.

## These Grants cannot be used for:

- Travelling expenses
- Personal debts or expenses
- Commercial or for-profit activities
- General or administrative expenses

Applications or work samples containing profanity, racism, sexism, homophobia, xenophobia, discriminatory behavior, or vulgarity will not be considered.

## Requirements:

- Projects must be completed between October 1, 2022 and September 30, 2023.
- The Alachua County Board of County Commissioners must be recognized on all printed and digital materials (if applicable).
- Art tag sales must be promoted in all printed and digital materials.

- Within 30 days of the close of the project, and no later than September 30, 2023, the applicant shall submit to the County a summary report describing the project and how the grant funding was used to complete the project including copies of paid receipts and relevant backup documentation.
- Mini grant award funding is paid at the beginning of the project with an invoice, not to exceed the maximum grant amount award.
- Matching grant award funding is paid on a reimbursement basis with an invoice and copies of paid receipts and relevant backup documentation required, not to exceed the maximum grant amount award.
