7. Adjournment


A motion was made by Joseph Benton and seconded by Catherine Striley to adjourn the meeting. Motion passed unanimously.

The Department of Health in Alachua County operates the "We Care" referral network providing dental services since 1993. The network coordinated service for 166 patients in FY 2022. "A" arrived to her appointment in tears because of the pain she was experiencing. We Care helped "A" through extractions and dentures and her confidence is through the roof with her new smile

The University of Florida College of Dentistry Comprehensive Care Program pairs residents with dental students to provide services at significantly reduced fees. Last year, the program was able to provide 763 procedures (waiting on success story)
