The attached memo was discussed by Ms. Boyes which reveals that 100% of the surtax proceeds can be spent on parks and recreation-type facilities, but no more than 50% can be spent on infrastructure like roads, fire stations, etc.

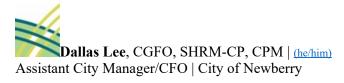
