In 2017, Grace Grows (GG) conducted a study in collaboration with the UF Department of Community Health and Family Medicine to assess the nutritional, physical, and mental health of 300 sheltered and unsheltered homeless people in Alachua County. For GG, the primary aim of the study was to evaluate the need for implementing a community garden along with educational interventions to enhance health behaviors among this group. Study results confirmed previous research on the health risks of homelessness, particularly regarding weight and poor nutrition. According to the study, being overweight, mental illness, and access to healthy food were reported to be the top three most impactful personal health issues. Survey data affirmed that translating these results into an effective community garden intervention would be well-received and may address some of the power inequities and the marginalization of these individuals while simultaneously improving healthy behaviors and decreasing chronic disease risk for people experiencing homelessness.

Grace Grows offers residents sheltered at Grace Marketplace therapeutic gardening and horticultural vocational training programs. The individuals served by GG are among the most vulnerable population in our community, living well below 150% of the Federal Poverty Level. Since 2018, 200 people at Grace Marketplace have participated in the programs offered by GG and have learned to grow food in the half-acre teaching garden, growing their own gardens and producing 1,500 pounds of produce a year for themselves and the shelter kitchen. Until recently GG received some of the materials needed for the garden from Working Food who has been a collaborator and supporter since 2015. However, because Working Food no longer has that funding source GG has had to source those materials independently or go without. In order to conduct the Grace Grows Horticultural Therapy Program and Grace Grows Garden program better, GG requires a small number of infrastructural improvements that include the ability to make the garden accessible to people with varying mobility, rebuild old raised garden beds, material inputs for farming like compost and mulch and a truck to transport farm materials. This would allow GG to grow 33 percent more food to supply homeless gardeners as well as include three times as many people with disabilities in our therapeutic program that can benefit physical and mental health.

The funds requested in this proposal will enable Grace Grows to make enhancements to our garden's infrastructure that improve environmental sustainability, resource efficiency, and ADA accessibility. We aim to replace the 22 wooden raised beds that currently exist in the Grace Grows Garden and are in use by people who are experiencing homelessness. Due to the natural breaking down of wood, the garden beds have needed to be replaced every two years, which has been costly for our small nonprofit. By rebuilding the beds with a durable material that will likely last over 10 years, we can improve our cost efficiency and improve the gardener's experience because they will no longer need to deal with beds that are deteriorating. We will also be able to construct four beds to be ADA accessible by elevating them off the ground, thereby giving access to people who have physical disabilities that hinder them from bending down and/or cause them to use a wheelchair. Considering that about 43 percent of people who experience homelessness have a physical disability, compared to 17 percent of housed people, improving inclusivity by giving people who have physical disabilities access to our horticultural therapy programs is a goal for GG. We will also increase accessibility to the garden space in general by installing a concrete path to the garden.

The cost and materials savings from rebuilding the garden beds using more durable materials will have a positive environmental impact, as will improving water efficiency by installing a timer-based irrigation system. Because we are serving a vulnerable population of people who are more likely to experience states of crisis that require extended absences from the garden, it will improve the garden's efficiency to water each bed on a regular schedule via automatic, timer-based irrigation.

Lastly, Grace Grows has a need to transport soil, produce, farm equipment, and plant donations but currently has no vehicle to do so. A used farm truck would help us to operate the garden and programming more effectively. A truck can also allow garden produce to be transported to the homes of newly-housed garden members, and/or help transport building materials so home gardens of their own can be built.

# 16. Describe the timeline and anticipated milestone dates for the project:\*

Grace Grows intends on completing this project within 8 months of being awarded, from, October 1, 2023, to June 1, 2024. The majority of the work - the new garden bed installation - will occur in the Fall of 2023 and Spring of 2024 because most of our outside volunteers are college students and this is when they engage the most. The kits that we propose to purchase and use for the more durable raised garden beds are do-it-yourself style kits that GG can train volunteers to assist with putting together after the volunteers assist with removing the existing lumber being used for

the garden beds. Once the new garden beds are installed, a third-party contractor would be hired to assist with the installation of an irrigation system, including an additional hose bib located closer to the garden than that which is currently being used.

The construction of the concrete path and accessible garden beds could begin immediately in November 2023 and will only take about a month to complete with the support of horticultural therapy interns from the University of Florida. The purchase of the truck, compost, and mulch would take place in the Month of October 2023.

- The completion of construction of the accessible garden beds and accessible pathway by December 1st, 2023
- The purchase of a new farm truck, compost, and mulch, by November 1st, 2023
- Installation of 20 new long-lasting garden beds by June 1st, 2024.
- Installation of irrigation system in the garden by June 1st, 2024.
- A 500 percent increase in garden usage for people who have mobility limitations
- · The ability to add two additional clients to the horticultural therapy program
- Increase of healthy produce that goes to the shelter kitchen and guests by 500 lbs. as a result of proper agricultural inputs like mulch and soil.
