- Installation of security cameras throughout the campus: This will help protect us from outside threats, identify and monitor internal threats such as bullying, and curtail risky behaviors during the school day. It will also help maintain "sight and sound" supervision of girls as mandated by our DJJ contracts.
- Removal of the large window in the front of each classroom (7 in all). No safety glass will protect the students and staff in their classroom should someone come on campus with a high-powered rifle. The windows will be replaced with cinderblocks to match the existing building structure.
- Creation of escape routes from the classrooms. Our classroom building is situated at the rear of the campus. There are seven
 classrooms, each with two exit doors in the front. All classrooms are connected by interior doors. Should an active shooter
 arrive, installation of safety doors in the rear of 4 classrooms would allow staff and students to evacuate safely in an emergency.

Of the girls we serve, 95% come from households at or below 150% of the FPL and all participate in the NSLP. 79% are Black, 14% are White, and 7% are Hispanic (Percentages may vary slightly as girls enter and transition from our program.). Girls attending the Center show significantly high academic challenges: 84% are failing at least one class and 52% have been suspended or expelled, leading to high levels of community disengagement (87%), delinquent behaviors (88%), behavioral health risks (88%), and significant challenges with relationships.

Installation of enhanced security measures will result in students and staff feeling more secure and therefore, better able to concentrate in the classroom and in counseling sessions. We also anticipate:

- · Fewer acts of vandalism
- · Better attendance
- · Increased academic improvement
- · Less bullying among students
- · Less risky behavior
- Fewer girls involved with the juvenile justice system.

Our campus safety upgrade is a three-tiered approach to securing the campus. Partial funding will allow us to initiate the upgrade. We have secured \$10K in matching funds.

- Greater security Video surveillance is the first line of defense for protection of the campus, staff, and students. External and internal cameras allow us to assess suspicious behaviors in real time and react accordingly.
- Fewer acts of vandalism (external threats) as demonstrated by reports to GPD. We have had several acts of vandalism that have unnerved the staff and girls. In addition, our storage shed is routinely broken into, regardless of the installation of a security lock and motion activated lights.
- Better attendance tracked in our student information management system. When girls feel safe, they come to school more often and better prepared to learn and embrace the counseling services available to them.
- Increased academic improvement as measured by our Star testing and number of credits earned
- Less risky behavior, as reported by the Social Service team. Cameras in the classrooms allow staff and teachers to monitor
