Witte has filed a Petition for Declaratory Judgment. Ms. Witte is the owner of two lots in the Tomoca Hills Unit No. 2 subdivision. Ms. Witte seeks a declaratory judgment to enjoin the County from further entry on a drainage easement and monetary damages due to alleged negative impacts to the lots. Under Alachua County Code 21.41(e), the County Attorney is authorized to prosecute and defend all legal actions by and against the County as approved by the Board.
