AWARD TERMS & CONDITIONS AND OTHER INSTRUCTIONS

General Conditions: FloridaCommerce has approved a grant award for your local workforce development board. These funds will be available for cash draws under the Subrecipient Enterprise Resource Application (SERA) Program Year and Program Title/Project in SERA described on page one of this notice. Expenditures utilizing these funds must be consistent with the Grantee/Subgrantee Agreement executed between the Board and FloridaCommerce and in compliance with the Board's approved plan and all federal and state rules, regulations, policies and grant conditions applicable to the grant program described on page one. The indirect cost rate or indirect cost method for this subaward, whether federal or non-federal, will be the federally recognized indirect cost rate negotiated between the Board and the federal government or, if no such rate exists, either a rate negotiated between FloridaCommerce and the Board, or if optionally elected by the Board, the de minimis rate or cost allocation method.

Special Grant Conditions: Hope Florida – A Pathway to Prosperity is a comprehensive approach to addressing poverty and promoting economic mobility in Florida. Through this initiative, the Florida Department of Children and Families (DCF) is guiding Floridians on an individualized path to prosperity, economic self-sufficiency and hope by focusing on community collaboration among the private sector, faith-based community organizations, non-profits and government entities to break down silos and connect Floridians to resources that lead to stability and new economic opportunities. This funding and focused effort by the CareerSource Florida network represent a workforce system-led expansion of the state's Hope Florida initiative to provide specialized services and programming through the workforce system and connect Hope Florida participants seeking jobs with employment and career opportunities. A separate Wagner-Peyser award funds Hope Florida Navigators to strengthen coordination between DCF and local workforce development boards.

This funding supports the delivery of specialized services and programming to help Hope Florida program participants find jobs, enroll in training and launch new career pathways that lead to self-sufficiency and economic prosperity. Funds may be used for staffing and the purchase of supplies and other expenses related to these services.

These specialized services and programming should include at a minimum:

- Processes that meet Hope Florida participants where they are, for example through online intake meetings.
- Robust assessments, development and refinement of individualized employability plans to include career pathways that lead to self-sufficiency.
- Leveraging available resources, such as local formula Wagner-Peyser and WIOA funds, to provide critical services. For example, WIOA formula funds may be used to provide supportive services when needed.
- Specialized services and programming for Hope Florida participants, through in-person peer support/job club settings, to acquire soft/foundational skills essential for job retention; engage in robust career exploration through site visits and/or virtual reality experiences; acquire occupational skills through classroom training (including quick

credentials); participate in work-based learning experiences; and encounter a broad mix of local employers from a variety of sectors. The duration of this programming needs to be suitable to the differing circumstances of Hope Florida participants.

• Joint case management of Hope Florida participants with DCF.

Participating areas should leverage the Florida CLIFF Dashboard suite of tools in case management, career coaching, and identifying necessary supportive services when working with Hope Florida participants.
