How We Got Here

- June 2019 Florida Statute 381.0038 signed into law by the Governor
- September 2020 BoCC Passed Local Ordinance 2020-20
- December 2020 Fully Executed Letter of Agreement with DOH
- May 2021 SOI Issued Requesting Proposals (check date)
- August 2021 WellFlorida Selected as Operator
- February 2022 WellFlorida Presentation to the BoCC
- September 2022 Anticipated Start Up
- December 2022 Viiv Funding Awarded
- March 2023 Florida Harm Reduction Collective, Inc. Plans to Expand

SB366: County Commission Responsibilities

County commission must contract with one of the following:

- Hospital
- Health care clinic
- Medical school in Florida
- Licensed addictions receiving facility
- 501(c)3 HIV/AIDS service organization

Initial Data Analysis and Findings

- Alachua County Syringe Exchange Program Needs Assessment
 - Program Attributes:
 - 60% prefer a mobile unit, 40% prefer a fixed location
 - Most frequently suggested locations for mobile services:
 - GRACE (56.7%)
 - Downtown (43.3%)
 - Holly Heights (15.7%)
 - Various locations on or near Archer Road (approximately 20%)

Initial Data Analysis and Findings

- Alachua County Syringe Exchange Program Needs Assessment, continued
 - Most frequently suggested locations for fixed locations:
 - GRACE (43.3%)
 - Downtown (33.3%)
 - Locations on bus route or bus station (10%)
 - Trusted Organizations (five most mentioned):
 - Out of Harm's Reach (43.3%)
 - Health Department (23%)
 - GRACE (20%)
 - UF Mobile Clinic or Street Outreach (13.3%)
 - Hospital (10%)
