Background:

As required in Resolution 22-105, "the Oversight Board Liaison shall be responsible for presenting the Oversight Board's financial report to the Board" (section 6.4).

At the June 26, 2023 Infrastructure Surtax Oversight Board (ISOB) meeting, the City of Alachua expressed interest in revitalizing the ballfield, lighting, basketball court, and multi-purpose field at Alachua Elementary. The park would be open to the public after school hours, on holidays, weekends, and during the summer. The Oversight Board requested a copy of their current Interlocal Agreement (executed in 1980) and justification for the project before making a determination.

At the July 24, 2023 ISOB meeting, the Oversight Board re-considered the Alachua Elementary project and asked for Board of County Commissioners policy direction on whether improvements on school board property is an appropriate use of surtax funds. Alachua County recently utilized Wild Spaces Public Places for improvements at Lake Forest Elementary. Outside Counsel, Patrice Boyes, provided the attached memo which addresses this topic.

The Oversight Board also reviewed the Joint Project Application Form at their June and July meetings. The attached was approved by consensus for your review and approval.
