Background



- Approached by UF Health in November
- Desire to partner with ACFR
- In FY 22, ACFR responded to 683 stroke emergencies
- Current procedure for stroke care
 - Stroke Alert and stabilize patient

- On board CT-Scanner
- Telemedicine Consult with Vascular Neurologist

Shared Employees



- By way of agreement ACFR staff will provide employees on "lease" to UF Health
- Better together
 - UF Health brings the clinical hospital experience
 - ACFR brings the emergency response and all hazards experience

Community Role

 Respond to stroke-like symptoms, provide community education, and train other first responders in stroke care

Neuro 1





UF Health has agreed that the unit will be co-branded with an Alachua County Fire Rescue emblem.



Goals of Program



- 1. To shorten the time between the onset of stroke-like symptoms and the delivery of intravenous thrombolytic for acute ischemic stroke patients
- To shorten the time between the onset of stroke-like symptoms and arterial puncture for large vessel occlusion, acute ischemic stroke patients
- 3. To shorten the time between the onset of stroke-like symptoms and anticoagulant reversal therapy for hemorrhagic stroke patients
- 4. To improve survivorship of acute stroke
- 5. To improve patient outcomes from acute stroke

The Process



- Initiation of 911
- Combined Communications Center determines call type
- Quickest resources are dispatched along with Neuro 1
- Assessment by first responders, findings communicated to Neuro 1
- Depending on location and time, Neuro 1 either arrives on scene or rendezvous with ACFR transporting rescue
- Assessment, CT scan, blood draw lab values, telemedicine consult with UF Health Vascular Neurologist, diagnosis, treatment with anticoagulants or thrombolytics
- Pt will be transported to the closest Comprehensive Stroke Center
- Bypass Emergency Room to inpatient stroke care area

Proposed Budgetary Plan



UF Health is assuming all costs associated with program

	Salary and Operating
EMS Attendant 2.0 FTEs	\$199,108
EMT Driver 2.0 FTEs	\$149,716
Captain of EMS 1.0 FTE	\$131,176
Total Personnel and Operating 5.0 FTEs	\$480,000

Captain will assist with programmatic functions to include oversight, training, and filling last-minute vacancies. The Captain will also assist the department with other EMS related programs.

Staff Recommendations



Authorize Chair to sign

- Interlocal Agreement with UF Health
- Lease Employee Agreement

Authorize Staff to advertise and hire

- Two (2) EMS/Attendants
- Two (2) EMT Drivers
- One (1) Captain of EMS
 - The Captains position will require Impact Bargaining
