#### RESOLUTION 84-7

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF ALACHUA COUNTY, FLORIDA, ESTABLISHING THE ENVIRONMENTAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE; ESTABLISHING THE RESPONSIBILITIES AND DUTIES THEREOF; PROVIDING FOR BYLAWS TO GUIDE THE OPERATION THEREOF; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, hazardous materials present in the community may pose acute and chronic health hazards to individuals who live and work in Alachua County, and who are exposed to such substances as a result of generating, treating, storing, disposing, or releasing hazardous materials; and,

WHEREAS, the risks and potential dangers of hazardous material storage, transportation, handling, and disposal within, near or through Alachua County have never been fully addressed; and

WHEREAS, such hazardous materials dangers pose a threat to the communities most important resource, the Floridan aquifer; and,

WHEREAS, the best protective methods will be realized by a thorough gathering of information, a careful examination of facts, a clear assessment of information, a comprehensive statement of the problems, a responsible and realistic plan of solution, and finally, the implementation of a plan; and,

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners desires to utilize an

#### **RESOLUTION 19-.84**

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF ALACHUA COUNTY, FLORIDA, AMENDING RESOLUTION 17-07 BY EXTENDING THE SUNSET DATE FOR THE ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION ADVISORY COMMITTEE; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, protection of soils, air, ground waters and surface waters of Alachua County is critical to ensuring protection of public health and safety; and,

WHEREAS, effective environmental regulatory, management, monitoring and public education programs in the areas of hazardous materials ,water quality ,air quality, household hazardous waste, and natural resource protection is important to maintaining the quality of life and natural resources of the County; and,

WHEREAS, responsible management of environmentally sensitive lands and watersheds is important for protecting water quality and maintaining healthy natural ecosystems; and,

WHEREAS, citizen input is important to the development of effective environmental programs and for the promotion of greater community involvement and awareness of local government environmental initiatives; and,

WHEREAS, since 1984 the Environmental Advisory Committee has been an effective vehicle for citizen input and review of environmental programs within Alachua County; and,

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners first established by Resolution 84-7 an Environmental Advisory Committee, increased the membership of the Environmental Advisory Committee by Resolutions 87-14 and 90-84, revised the attendance policy by Resolution 01-62, renamed the Advisory Committee by Resolution 02-81, re-established and added a sunset date by Resolution 09-80; amended the sunset date by Resolution 11-23 and Resolution 17-07,


WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners desires to extend the sunset date for the Environmental Protection Advisory Committee,




