Acknowledge receipt of SAS 114 letter from Auditors.

Background:

Florida Statutes require an audit of the financial statements of Alachua County by an independent certified public accountant. Purvis Gray and Company, LLP has completed the audit of the County's 2022 fiscal year financial reports. In addition, the Clerk's Finance and Accounting Department has completed the Florida State Comptrollers Annual Financial Report (AFR). The AFR has always been required and prepared by Finance and Accounting and submitted to the State, Department of Financial Services. The numbers reported are the same as reported in the ACFR, but are in a different format using State uniform account numbers. The AFR is required to be certified by the Chair of the Board of County Commissioners and the County Chief Financial Officer. The ACFR and Management

response letter are also submitted with the AFR to the State.

The National Government Finance Officers Association (GFOA) sponsors the Certificate of Achievement in Financial Reporting, which is designed to promote high levels of understandable financial reporting and disclosure. The program is also aimed at increasing the comparability of financial information between governmental units across the country. An award of the Certificate means that the County's Financial Report was strictly graded on over a hundred criteria. Holding the Certificate of Achievement is viewed favorably by bond rating agencies, bond insurers and financial markets. The County's 2022 report has been submitted for review.
