This project aims to enhance literacy and numeracy through intensive remediation, adaptive technology, parental support systems, and teacher efficacy. Caring and Sharing Learning School, a Title I school in east Gainesville, serves a 100% free lunch population under the Community Eligibility Program. The COVID-19 pandemic severely impacted students' access to academic and technological resources, resulting in a loss of two or more years of foundational instruction. 4th and 5th-grade students lacked a stable learning environment during their critical early years, hindering their development of basic reading and social skills. Providing targeted academic support that extends the school day and offering safe avenues for meaningful parental partnerships is crucial in alleviating financial and childcare burdens on families living in poverty. Unsupervised students without structured activities tend to fall behind academically and engage in unfavorable behaviors. In Alachua County, 81% of juveniles arrested between 2017 and 2018 were black, underscoring the need for meaningful extended learning beyond the traditional school day. Academic tutoring, targeted interventions, and parent learning opportunities help families set goals, track progress, and experience unfamiliar success. Tutoring provides a safe place for students outside school hours and addresses challenges manifested through behavioral infractions and poor engagement both in class and in the community. Current data shows students in tutoring perform 68% higher than peers, increasing performance by 71%, and reducing retentions to zero.

Anticipated benefits for families living below the poverty level:

- Improved literacy and numeracy skills through intensive remediation and targeted interventions.
- Reduced financial burden by providing academic support, meals, and out-of-school time care until late evening.
- Decreased likelihood of academic gaps and negative interactions with law enforcement.
- Enhanced parent involvement and empowerment through learning opportunities increase their ability to utilize resources and support students.
- Reduced student retention significantly improving academic performance through tutoring and personalized support.
- Increased economic mobility for families, enhanced social-emotional development, and improved parent-child relationships

Learning opportunities and comprehensive support proactively address barriers and foster positive outcomes for families and communities.

Technology provides diverse and engaging learning opportunities that go beyond traditional methods. With increased access to computers, tablets, software applications, and online resources, students can explore interactive multimedia content, engage in virtual simulations, and collaborate on projects. These immersive experiences foster critical thinking, problem-solving, and creativity, equipping students with skills necessary for the modern world. Technology and technological resources in the budget are vital to enhance learning opportunities, develop digital literacy skills, personalize instruction, promote global connectivity, streamline administrative processes, and prepare students to thrive in a rapidly evolving world.
- **\$25,000** - Additional Tutoring and After-School Student Support- The expansion of tutoring and support services is essential to address the diverse learning needs of our students, provide individualized attention, bridge learning gaps, build confidence, and enhance academic performance. By investing in additional tutoring, we are demonstrating our commitment to the success and well-being of our students, equipping them with the necessary tools and support to thrive academically and reach their full potential.
- **\$10,000** - Training/Professional Development - Training will empower teachers/staff with the knowledge and skills necessary to utilize data, address learning styles, remediate using best practices, deliver targeted instruction, and effectively incorporate technology into their teaching practices. Teachers and families will learn how to leverage educational software, online platforms, interactive multimedia, and virtual simulations to engage students and enhance their understanding of concepts. Training will

cover best practices for assessing technology tools, ensuring accessibility, fostering digital citizenship, identifying specific learning objectives, aligning instructional activities to objectives, and providing explicit instruction and scaffolding to guide students toward mastery.
