Transportation Alternatives Grant – What is it?

The Transportation Alternatives (TA) Set-Aside Program provides funding for programs and projects consistent with Fixing America's Surface Transportation (FAST) Act under 23 U.S.C. 133(h).

- All Counties and MPOs in District 2 are eligible to apply
- Municipalities may submit applications/priorities to Counties
- Each County may submit top two applications/priorities to FDOT
- Alachua County requested project suggestions from the eight smaller municipalities


- 1. Construction, planning and design of on and off-road facilities for bicyclists, pedestrians, and other forms of nonmotorized transportation (pedestrian and bicycle facilities)
- 2. Construction, planning and design of infrastructure-related projects/systems to provide safe routes for non-drivers including children, older adults, individuals with disabilities (safe routes for non-drivers)
- 3. 🛮 Conversion and use of abandoned railroad corridors for non-motorized use
- **4.** Donstruction of turnouts, overlooks, and viewing areas
- 5. Inventory, control or removal of outdoor advertising
- **6.** 🔲 Historic preservation and rehabilitation of historic transportation facilities
- 7. Uegetation management practices in transportation rights of way
- 8. Archaeological activities related to impacts from transportation projects
- **9.** \square Environmental mitigation activities
- 10. Safe Routes to School

- **Scope:** 12' multi-use path and related enhancements on north side of roadway
- **Award Ask:** \$1,599,431

- Purpose: provide safe, nonmotorized facility and better connect the Copeland Community
- **Scope:** 5' sidewalk and related enhancements on north side of roadway
- Award Ask: \$1,832,063
