- UF Health Urgent Care Center underway
- Construction for roadway infrastructure began on 1/16. Substantial completion is slated for 7/1/24
- RTS planned transfer hub
- Eastside Gateway refresh and banners installed along East University Avenue & Hawthorne Road
- Master plan complete for renovations of GTEC
- 22 incubating companies at GTEC, and they are 95% either minority or locally owned








Proposed Floorplans
