On January 17, 2024, following execution of a search warrant and under the authority given to animal enforcement officers pursuant to Section 828.073, Florida Statutes, six dogs were lawfully seized from the property located 16912 SW Archer Road owned by Shawntavia Hunt. The conditions in which the animals were kept or housed did not meet the County standards under Alachua County sec. 72.10 and there was indication of a lack of proper and reasonable care of the animals and neglect and/or mistreatment. Ms. Hunt was found to be the owner of the animals. A Petition will be -- or already has been -- timely filed in the County Court of the Eighth Judicial Circuit in and for Alachua County, Florida. The law requires such Petition to be filed within 10 days after the animals are seized. Under Alachua County Code 21.41(e), the County Attorney is authorized and directed to take such action on behalf of the County as to protect the rights of the County in any legal action or to seek emergency relief, pending an opportunity to request required approval of the Board.

2. John A. McKinley and Rosemary McKinley, Plaintiffs, vs. Alachua County Board of County Commissioners, Defendant Case #2024-CA-0001
