Background:

The Florida Department of Law Enforcement, Byrne Justice Assistance Grant (JAG)- Countywide is allocated annually to each county through the Board of County Commissioners (BoCC). The Countywide grant requires the BoCC follow a process that complies with 11D-9.005(a) F.A.C. to apply. To comply, the BoCC created the Byrne Grant Advisory Board to review proposals and provide funding recommendations to the BoCC. Subsequent to the BoCC approving the projects, FDLE is notified via the "51% letter", and each entity with an approved project applies separately to FDLE. The Sheriff's Office coordinates the Byrne Advisory Board process with the Clerk of Court, who sits as the Chair of the Byrne Advisory Board.
