AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF ALACHUA COUNTY, FLORIDA, PROPOSING AN AMENDMENT TO SECTION 2.2(A) OF THE ALACHUA COUNTY HOME RULE CHARTER, PROVIDING FOR MEMBERS OF THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS TO BE ELECTED ON A COUNTYWIDE BASIS; PROVIDING FOR A REFERENDUM ON THE QUESTION OF ADOPTION OF A PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO THE COUNTY CHARTER; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE, IF APPROVED BY A MAJORITY OF ELECTORS; PROVIDING FOR INCLUSION IN THE CODE OF LAWS AND ORDINANCES OF ALACHUA COUNTY AND CORRECTION OF SCRIVENER'S ERRORS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR CONSTRUCTION AND INTERPRETATION: AND ALLOWING FOR MODIFICATION OF THE LANGUAGE OF THE ORDINANCE DUE TO CONSIDERATIONS ARISING AT A PUBLIC HEARING; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

30 31 WHEREAS, Alachua County established a charter form of government pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 125, Part IV, Florida Statutes, effective January 1, 1987; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners adopted an ordinance to approve the Alachua County Home Rule Charter ("Charter") on September 9, 1986 and the Charter was approved by a majority of all voters voting in the special election held as part of the general election on November 4, 1986; and

WHEREAS, the Charter provides that amendments to the Charter may be proposed by an ordinance adopted by the Board of County Commissioners by an affirmative vote of a majority plus one of the membership of the Board of County Commissioners; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners desires to propose an ordinance for adoption to amend the Alachua County Charter to provide for the members of the Board of County Commissioners to be elected on a countywide basis by the electors of the county.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF ALACHUA COUNTY, FLORIDA:

SECTION 1. **Authorization and Legislative Findings**. This Ordinance is authorized by Chapter 125, Part IV, Florida Statutes, and Article IV, Sections 4.2(C) and 4.2(0), Alachua County Charter, and other applicable law. The Board of County Commissioners finds and declares that all the statements set forth in the preamble of this ordinance are true and correct and are incorporated herein.

SECTION 2. Amendments to the Alachua County Home Rule Charter. The proposed amendment to the Alachua County Charter amending Section 2.2(A) pertaining to members of the Board of County Commissioners being elected on a countywide basis, set forth in Exhibit "A," attached hereto and incorporated herein, is proposed for adoption in accordance with Subsection 4.2(C)(1), Alachua County Charter.

SECTION 3. Referendum.

- a. The proposed amendment to the Alachua County Charter in Section 2 of this ordinance shall be presented to the County electorate on the ballot at the general election to be held on November 5, 2024.
- b. The Supervisor of Elections of Alachua County shall cause the following question to be placed on the ballot at the general election to be held on November 5, 2024.

AMENDING THE COUNTY CHARTER TO PROVIDE FOR COUNTY COMMISSIONER ELECTIONS ON AN AT LARGE BASIS

Shall the five members of the board of county commissioners of Alachua County, Florida, be elected by all electors within the county at large?

SECTION 4. **Effective Date of Charter Amendment**. This amendment to the Alachua County Charter adopted as set forth in Exhibit "A" shall be effective on January 1, 2025, only if approved by a majority of the electors voting in the general election to be held on November 5, 2024.

SECTION 5. Inclusion in the Code, Scrivener's Error. It is the intention of the Board of County Commissioners of Alachua County, Florida, and it is hereby provided that the provisions of this ordinance shall become and be made a part of the Code of Laws and Ordinances of Alachua County, Florida; that the sections of this ordinance may be renumbered or relettered to accomplish such intention; and that the word "ordinance" may be changed to "section," "article," or other appropriate designation. The correction of typographical errors which do not affect the intent of the ordinance may be authorized by the County Manager or designee without public hearing, by filing a corrected or recodified copy of the same with the Clerk of the Circuit Court.

SECTION 6. Severability. It is the declared intent of the Board of County Commissioners that, if any section, sentence, clause, phrase or provision of this ordinance is for any reason held or declared to be unconstitutional, void, or inoperative by a court or agency of competent jurisdiction, such holding of

remainder of this ordinance after the exclusion of such part or parts shall be deemed to be valid. 72 SECTION 7. Liberal Construction and Interpretation. This ordinance shall be liberally 73 construed in order to effectively carry out the purposes hereof which are deemed to be in the best interest 74 of the public health, safety, and welfare of the citizens and residents of Alachua County, Florida. 75 76 SECTION 8. Modification. It is the intent of the Board of County Commissioners that the 77 provisions of this ordinance may be modified as a result of considerations that may arise during public 78 hearings. Such modifications shall be incorporated into the final version of the ordinance adopted by the 79 Board and filed by the Clerk to the Board. 80 SECTION 9. Effective Date. Exhibit A

Sec. 2.2. – Legislative branch.

A. The county commission. The governing body of the county shall be a board of county commissioners composed of five (5) members serving staggered terms of four (4) years. There shall be one (1) commissioner for each of five (5) county commission districts established pursuant to general law and they shall be elected by the qualified electors of that district on a countywide basis by the electors of the county. Each candidate for the office of county commissioners shall reside within the district from which such candidate seeks election at the time of qualified to run for that office, and during the term of office each commissioner shall reside in the district from which such commissioner ran office, provided that any commissioner who is removed from a district by redistricting may continue to serve during the balance of the term of office.
