Heirs Property and Estate Planning Clinic

- Why Should the County Support this Clinic?
 - Keeping people in their homes is an important solution to the affordable housing crisis
 - There are over 1700 parcels of heirs' property land in Alachua County and 1400 parcels of land with a deceased co-owner at risk of falling into heirs' property
 - 200 people on waiting list at Three Rivers Legal Services
 - The longer people wait to probate their property the more likely they are to lose it and the more expensive it will be to clear title

What is CGR currently doing to help?

- CGR has partnered with the Alachua County Property Appraiser's Office to participate in the Estate Planning Summits
- CGR has partnered with BLAAC (Bailey Learning and Arts Collective) to help inform community members of the risks of heirs' property
- CGR faculty provide outreach and educational events on estate planning
- CGR helps organize students to volunteer with the Self-Help Center at the Alachua County Courthouse

What could we do if we had an HPEP Clinic?

- Undertake 8-12 complex probate proceedings for qualified county residents
- 16-24 summary probate proceedings and/or homestead determinations for qualified county residents
- 50 simple estate plans (ladybird deeds, wills, joint tenancy deeds)
- Background preparation on 50 heirs' property cases for TRLS or other legal partners
- Provide more community education and outreach
- Organize students for the Self-Help Center to staff it 52 weeks/year
- Sponsor internships at Three Rivers Legal Services and the Federation of Southern Cooperatives
- Provide a model for other law schools in the state and region

What would it cost?

- \$80,000 to \$100,000 to hire a clinic director
- \$24,000-\$30,000 for fringe and benefits
- Overhead at \$30,000 (administrative support, office space, malpractice insurance)
- \$10,000 travel
- \$10,000 computer and supplies
- Total \$180,000 annually
 - \$60,000 Alachua County
 - \$60,000 City of Gainesville
 - \$60,000 Levin College of Law Matching Funds
