Approve the agreement template and authorize the County Manager to execute agreements with each grantee, including those where the funding recommendations exceeds \$50,000; with all grant awards to be payable on a reimbursement basis only. Make the legislative factual determination that the events, venues and activities recommended for funding have as one of their main purposes the attraction of tourists as evidenced and as set forth in their respective applications, and that each grant award is primarily related to the advancement and promotion of tourism.
