Background:

Hodge Farms, Newberry, FL was selected as the 2024 County Alliance for Responsible Environmental Stewardship (CARES) recipient. This is a statewide award presented by Florida Farm Bureau & UF/IFAS. The CARES program publicly recognizes Florida Farmers and ranchers who demonstrate exemplary efforts to protect Florida's natural resource by implementing Best Management Practices. Recipients are awarded yearly to ag producers and families that are fully committed to protecting Florida's environment.

The Hodge family in Newberry was the only winner this year statewide. The Hodge family is one of our multi generational farming families in the county; they farm blueberries, cattle, watermelons, and other crops.
