# Mobile Integrated Healthcare Team



- **A multidisciplinary team**
- **Support patients and families by offering:**
  - Post EMS intervention
  - Assessment
  - Substance abuse management
  - Disease management
  - Care coordination
  - Resource provision
  - Emotional support
  - Advocacy to ensure patients have access to the appropriate level of care
  - Ensure patients have the opportunity to strive for the highest life quality they envision for themselves

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## Goal:

To provide a holistic approach to community health with a focus on substance abuse disorders, ensuring timely access to healthcare services that empower individuals to reclaim their mental health and overall well-being.



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- **Priorities**

- **Addiction/Withdrawal**
  - Provide peer support coaching and development of recovery network
  - Counseling
  - Case management and connection with resources such as primary care providers
  - Supplemental Nutritional Assistance Program (SNAP)
  - Housing assistance and connection to Medical Assisted Treatment (MAT) programs
  - The Coordinated Opioid Recovery Team (CORE) will provide critical MAT during gap-times when a participant might be experiencing significant withdrawals but have not yet accessed a provider for help
- **Comprehensive support to improve the health and wellness of Alachua County residents**
  - Address needs of our super users to reduce 911 calls and hospital visits/readmissions
  - Assist with managing chronic medical conditions (diabetes, heart disease, cardiac arrest survivors, LVAD patients)
  - Fall prevention
  - Community outreach and education

- Accept referrals from local hospitals
- Enhance our chronic disease management programs for both adults and pediatrics
- Remain flexible to adapt to the evolving needs of the residents of Alachua County
