Background:

Community Agency Partnership Program (CAPP) currently awards 3-year funding to successful applicants that provide programming in specific categories to benefit Alachua County residents at or below 150% of the Federal Poverty Level. For a variety of reasons, the annual budgeted amount is often not fully expended. This RFA awards one-time grants for special projects or capital purchases/improvements using the unexpended dollars.

Twenty-two applications were received and evaluated by the Grant Review Committee. A public meeting was held on November 13, 2024, where the Committee met and made their recommendations for funding based on the scoring of the proposals.

Total funding recommended by the Grant Review Committee \$148,000.00
