1. Summary of the proposed ordinance (must include a statement of the public purpose, such as serving the public health, safety, morals and welfare):

The County utilizes citations and a special magistrate code enforcement hearing process to obtain compliance of a violation of the Alachua County Code, including its land development regulations. The proposed ordinance will update sections of Alachua County Code regarding Code Enforcement to provide clarity and updates to be consistent with Florida law and County practices. The proposed ordinance will provide clarity on issuing and delivering citations and providing notices. The ordinance also expands jurisdiction of code enforcement by the County in the city limits of the City of Hawthorne and any other municipality that enters into an interlocal agreement with the County for code enforcement services. The Public purposes as stated in the ordinance are to assist with the enforcement of the Alachua County Code.
