Our primary goal is to assist this population. According to our local Department of Juvenile Justice statistics, there were 818 total arrests of juveniles in Alachua County in 2023; male youth made up five hundred ninetyone of these arrests, and males of color made up 471 of the total arrests. Addressing these disparities involves systemic changes, community engagement, and targeted interventions. Recognizing and challenging these factors is crucial for promoting equity and reducing the disproportionate involvement of minority youth in the criminal justice system. Our goal at Baxter's Place is to provide aftercare components for youth who meet the federal poverty level by providing these youth with academic enrichment activities by certified teachers from Alachua County. We plan to transport the selected child to our facility, where the youth will engage in educational activities through social and emotional learning. Supporting the social and emotional development of male middle school students, especially those facing economic challenges, is essential to the youth's overall well-being. The youth will engage in exercises such as the circle of control, where they learn the difference between things within their control. They will explore the connection between thoughts, emotions, actions, and conflicts outside their influence. Active Listening Skills, Time Management, Empathy Building, positive affirmation, and conflict resolution. In addition, the youth will have a meal to fellowship with each other and meet their needs. We will use some funds to create a website for Baxter's Place. A well-designed website is like having a welcoming front door for our nonprofit organization; this site will have features of awareness that allow us to tell Baxter's Place story. The website will provide a donation portal, a convenient way for supporters to donate online. The website will Be transparent about where donations go and how they impact our mission and build trust. This website will share success stories, financial reports, and updates. We will also use the website to recruit volunteers. Highlight volunteer roles, upcoming events, and ways people can get involved. Lastly, we will use the site to update our community with blog posts, news articles, and success stories. We believe in Engaging our community, keeping them informed for general knowledge, and assisting in building capacity for the program.

Academic Achievement:

Attendance and Engagement:

Financial literacy: Measure participants' understanding of basic economic concepts (e.g., budgeting, saving).

Problem-solving skills: Assess their ability to identify and address real-life challenges.

Sense of Belonging and Community Involvement:

Increased sense of belonging: Gauge participants' feelings of connection to peers, mentors, and the community. Bimonthly Group Projects: These Collaborative projects allow participants to work together, learn from one another, and build connections.

Community engagement: Track their involvement in community service or volunteering in Alachua County.

Workplace etiquette.

Parent Engagement: Measure how involved parents or guardians are in the program. Their engagement correlates with program success—monthly parent engagement meetings.

Criminal Justice involvement monitors the Juvenile justice system to ensure the youth's avoidance of criminal behavior.
