Current Vacancies

- Law Enforcement
 - ▶ 38 Current Vacant Positions
 - ▶ Includes Patrol, Traffic Unit, Detectives, Warrants Investigators, Supervisor Positions
 - ▶ This number represents current unfilled positions. We have some Cadets/Trainees in various phases of training.
- Department of the Jail
 - ▶ 68 Current Vacant Positions
 - ▶ Includes Detention Officers, Detention Deputies, and Sworn/Certified Supervisor positions



Department of the Jail Recruiting

- Recent agreement with DOJ PBA Members
- ► "any bargaining unit member who had a previous separation of twenty-four (24) months (730 days) thirty-six (36) months or less, will be given credit for their previous years in the Step Pay Plan provided the separation and re-hire was after October 1, 2020."
- Contacting employees who separated in 2022 (Major Keith)
- ► Increased staffing would help reinstitute/institute specialty programs like Paws on Parole, GED Program, Domestic Violence Program



Proposed Step Pay Plan Increase of 3.8%

- Current starting salary for Detention Officers, Detention Deputies, and Deputy Sheriffs is \$53,000
- A 3.8% increase to the step plan would bring the starting salary to \$55,014
- The ACSO can fund this increase from within for the remainder of this fiscal year
- Request for the BOCC to commit to funding the increase in FY 25/26 with a further goal of increasing starting pay for sworn/certified to \$57,500 on October 1st, 2025
