3) Approval of Minutes from October 24th, 2024

4) **Property Evaluations – Staff Presentations**

a) Lochloosa Creek Flatwoods – Lakes of Hawthorne LLC Presented by: Mike Nelson Nominated by Putnam Land Conservancy as fee simple acquisition

Willy The Losen and Joe Foye from Putnam Land Conservancy spoke about the property: Property lies within the boundary of the new Florida Forever Project: Little Orange Creek Corridor. Large property to the east in Putnam County is being restored; new owners seeking an easement.

Nominated land in Alachua County contains portion of historic Micanopy to Palatka Road William Bartram traveled the road and stopped at Little Orange Lake after crossing Little Orange Creek and noted evidence of an indigenous settlement on the bluff of the lake.

Motion was made by Tom Mirti to place only lot #19952-000-000 on the eligibility pool with an access easement. Motion fails for lack of a second.

Motion was made by Bruce Blackwell to place Lakes of Hawthorne LLC in the priority pool.

Chris DeCubellis spoke about the property He has lived on the property for 20 years and wants to preserve "Old Florida" character. Wants to continue grazing cattle on the majority of the property.
