



Melanie Barr has participated on the Micanopy Truth and Reconciliation Committee.
- Assisted County Ancient Records Clerk with transcription of documents.
- Ongoing work on documenting historic cemeteries.
- Conducting research on BoCC Assignment on history of BoCC from at least 1824; wrote narrative.

Preservation of Historical Resources

Preservation Current FY Work Plan related to Protection of Historical Resources

- Assist County Manager with BoCC Assignment on "Truth and Reconciliation"; Assist with Black Heritage Trail Website if needed.
- Continue Research BoCC Assignment on history of Florida Indians/Indigenous people.
- Discussion of research of any inquiries submitted by BoCC or County Manager.
- Continue work with EPD on Black Lake ACF project and Parks on possible Cuscowilla State historic marker.
- Continue work to add all documented cemetery sites to Florida Master Site File.
- Assist local property owners with research and preservation as possible.
- Continue to assist Ancient Records Coordinator with transcriptions; etc.
- Continue to research and write State Historic Markers. Organize dedications and help other organizations with organizing their dedications; Assist others as well.

Protection of Historical Resources

Protection Current FY Work Plan related to Protection of Historical Resources

- Finalize process for the local designation of historic structures (an Alachua County Historic Register) as part of Draft Historic Preservation Ordinance.
- Work to achieve Certified Local Government status for Alachua County.
- Begin development of Historic Preservation Master Plan.
- Continue Historic Ad Valorem Exemptions administration (staff & Gainesville HPB).
- Assist local County organizations and agencies with grant searches & writing when possible, and letters of support for grant efforts.

Promotion Current FY Work Plan related to Protection of Historical Resources

- Receive public input at a meeting of the BoCC to consider Certified Local Government status and establishment of County Historic Pres. Board.
- Participate in planning the observance of the Bicentennial of Alachua County Incorporation, and assist with events celebrating the history.
- Provide support as necessary to community effort to preserve the Old Mount Carmel Church.
- Keep apprised of the current condition of the Rochelle School and Church. If requested assist any community effort.
- NR nominations & more; Assist with letters of support for NR nominations and sites as requested.
- Collaborate with county-wide historical societies and organizations.
- Explore options for updating historic tours of County small towns, coordinate with VisitGainesville.
- Continue 3 Minute Historical Readings at BoCC meetings
- Continue efforts for County scenic roads and vistas; assist Old Florida Heritage Highway efforts.
- Continue collaboration with State Byway program and community support organization.
 Consider possibility to extend Old Florida Heritage Highway to include Barr Hammock access (Jubilee Rd.) and Gainesville Sweetwater Wetlands Park (portion of Williston Rd.) if community supports.
- Participate in community discussions of local history & interpretation.
