AGREEMENT BETWEEN ALACHUA COUNTY & IVS INC, D/B/A ANGEL TRAX FOR DASH CAMERA INSTALLATION AND SERVICES NO. 14391

This Agreement ("Agreement") is made by and between Alachua County, Florida, a political subdivision and charter county of the State of Florida, by and through its Board of County Commissioners (the "County") and IVS Inc, d/b/a Angel Trax, a Foreign for Profit Corporation which is authorized to do business in the State of Florida ("Contractor"), who are collectively referred to as the "Parties".

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the County publicly issued a competitive solicitation (Invitation to Bid (ITB) 24-487) seeking qualified firms or individuals to provide Dash Camera Installation and Services; and

WHEREAS, after evaluating and considering all timely responses to the solicitation, the County identified Contractor as top ranked entity in the solicitation process; and

WHEREAS, the Contractor is willing to provide work and services to the County; and

WHEREAS, the County desires to engage Contractor to provide the work and services described herein.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises and covenants contained herein, and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt of which is acknowledged, the County and Contractor agree as follows:

- 1. <u>Recitals</u>. The foregoing recitals are incorporated herein.
- 2. <u>Scope of Services/Work</u>. In accordance with the terms and conditions of this Agreement, Contractor agrees to provide Dash Camera Installation and Services, as more particularly described in the Scope of Services/Work attached hereto as **Exhibit "1"** and incorporated herein ("Services") for and as needed by the County. It is understood that the Services may be modified, but to be effective and binding, any such modification must be in writing executed by both the Parties.
- 3. <u>Term.</u> This Agreement is effective upon execution by both Parties("effective date") and continues for a period of two years, or until this Agreement is earlier terminated as provided herein. This Agreement may be amended at the option of the County for two (2) additional four (4) year term(s) at the same terms and conditions outlined herein. The Contractor may choose not to renew this Agreement provided the Contractor provides the County with written notice ninety (90) days prior to the end of the currently effective contract term.
- 4. <u>Closeout</u>. The Contractor's obligation to the County shall not end until all closeout requirements are completed. Activities during the close-out period shall include, but are not limited to, making final payments, submitting final reimbursement request and final activity/accomplishment report to the County, disposing of project assets (including the return of all equipment, and receivable accounts to the County), and determining the custodianship of records. Agreement closeout is not considered final until the County is fully satisfied that project objectives have been met and the Contractor has submitted the Contract Closeout Checklist, attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit "5".
- 5. <u>Qualifications</u>. By executing this Agreement, Contractor makes the following representations to County:
 - A. Contractor is qualified to provide the Services and will maintain all certifications, permits and licenses necessary to provide the Services during the term of this Agreement.
 - B. Contractor will assure that all personnel who perform the Services, or perform any part of the Services, are competent, reliable, and experienced to perform their assigned task property and satisfactory. Contractor will perform the Services with the skill and care which would be

exercised by a qualified contractor performing similar services at the time and place such services are performed. If failure to meet these standards results in a deficiency in the Services or the related tasks or designs, Contractor will, at his/her/its own cost and expense, re-do the Services to correct the deficiency, and shall be responsible for any and all general damages arising from the deficiency.

C. Contractor is familiar with the Services and the conditions of the site, location, project, and specifics of the Services to be provided, designed or constructed.

D. Contractor will coordinate, cooperate, and work with any other contractors, professionals, and consultants retained by the County. The Parties acknowledge that there is nothing in this Agreement that precludes County from retaining services of other contractors, professionals, and consultants for similar or same Services or from independently performing the Services provided under this Agreement on its own.

6. Payment.

- A. The County will pay Contractor for timely and completed Services as described in this Agreement in accordance with the Rate Schedule attached as Exhibit "2" and incorporated herein
- B. The Parties agree that the amount to be paid to Contractor for the Services will not exceed \$1,013,440.50 ("NTE amount") for the first two year term of this Agreement payable in the following manner:

- C. The Parties agree that for any renewal terms of this Agreement, as described in Paragraph 3 above, that a Not to Exceed shall be established based on the needs of the County in accordance with the Rate Schedule in **Exhibit** "2".
- D. If requested price adjustments (whether an increase or decrease) will be based on the change in the Consumer Price Index or for the preceding twelve (12) months as calculated and published by the United States Department of Labor.
- E. Prices adjustments may be submitted in writing per contract renewal period with a ninety (90) calendar day notice. The County reserves the right to accept and approve any price adjustments, add items, and services per a negotiated rate during the term of the agreements and added during the renewal process.
- F.As a condition precedent for any payment, Contractor must submit invoices to the County requesting payment for Services properly rendered and expenses due, unless otherwise agreed in writing by the County. Contractor's invoice must describe the Service rendered, the date performed [and time expended, if billed by hour], and the person(s) rendering such Services. Contractor's invoice shall be accompanied by documentation or data in support of expenses, as the County may require. Each invoice shall constitute the Contractor's representation to the County that the Services indicated have reached the level stated, have served a public purpose,

have been properly and timely performed, that the expenses included in the invoice have been reasonably incurred in accordance with this Agreement, that all obligations of Contractor covered by prior invoices have been paid in full, and that the amount requested is currently due and owing. Submission of the Contractor's invoice for final payment shall further constitute the Contractor's representation to the County that, upon receipt by the Contractor of the amount invoiced, all obligations of the Contractor to others, including its subcontractors, will be paid in full. Contractor shall submit invoices to the County at the following address, unless otherwise directed by the County:

C. County will make payment to Contractor of all sums properly invoiced under the provisions of this section in accordance with the provisions of the Florida Prompt Payment Act, Chapter 218, Part VII, Florida Statutes, and the County shall remit all payments to:

- H. If the County has reasonable cause to suspect that any representations of Contractor relating to payment are inaccurate, the County may withhold payment of sums then or in the future otherwise due to Contractor until the inaccuracy, and the cause thereof, is corrected to the County Manager's or his/her designee's reasonable satisfaction.
- I. The County's performance and obligation to pay under this Agreement is contingent upon a specific annual appropriation by the Alachua County Board of County Commissioners ("Board"). The Parties hereto understand that this Agreement is not a commitment of future appropriations. Continuation of this Agreement beyond the term or the end of any County fiscal year shall be subject to both the appropriation and the availability of funds in accordance with Chapter 129, Florida Statutes; and that the failure of the Board to do so shall not constitute a breach or default of this Agreement.
- J. In the event any part of this Agreement or the Services, is to be funded by Federal, State, or other local agency monies, Contractor hereby agrees to cooperate with the County in order to assure compliance with all requirements of the funding entity applicable to the use of the monies, including providing access to and the right to examine relevant documents related to the Service and as specifically required by the Federal or State granting agency, and receiving no payment until all required forms are completed and submitted.
- 8. <u>Insurance</u>. Contractor will procure and maintain insurance throughout the entire term of this Agreement, including any renewals, of the types and in the minimum amounts detailed in **Exhibit "3"** attached hereto and incorporated herein. A copy of a current Certificate of Insurance (COI) showing coverage of the type and in the amounts required is attached hereto as **Exhibit "3-A"**.
- 9. <u>County Property</u>. Contractor shall be responsible for clean-up and the removal of surplus materials and debris on the Service/work site. Contractor agrees to promptly, without delay, notify the County either in phone, email, or orally of any hazardous, dangerous, unsafe, or destructive conditions, trespassers, vandalism or damages that the Contractor or its employees, subcontractors, or agents notices or is made aware of on County property, including inside any County owned or used facility. Contractor shall be responsible for initiating, erecting, and maintaining safety precautions, programs and materials in connection with the Services on County Property, including any industry, federal, state or local standards and requirements, so as to prevent damages, injury or loss to persons and property. Should an employee or agent of the Contractor suffer injury or damage to its/his/her person or property, the Contractor shall notify

the County within a reasonable time of the occurrence. The costs of any clean-up, spillage, and fines levied for failure to comply with these requirements will be borne solely by Contractor.

- 10. <u>Deliverables</u>. All project deliverables and documents are the sole property of County and may be used by County for any purpose. Any and all deliverables required by this Agreement to be prepared by Contractor, such as but not limited to plans and specifications, will be done in such a manner that they shall be accurate, coordinated and adequate for the purposes intended. Contractor represents that the deliverables prepared under this Agreement will meet the requirements of all applicable federal, state and local codes, laws, rules and regulations. The County's review of the deliverables in no way diminishes the Contractor's representations pertaining to the deliverables.
- 11. <u>Permits</u>. Contractor will obtain and pay for all necessary permits, permit application fees, licenses or any fees required for performing the Services.
- Alachua County Minimum Wage. If, as determined by County, the Services to be performed 12. pursuant to this Agreement are 'Covered Services', as defined under the Alachua County Government Minimum Wage Ordinance ("Wage Ordinance"), then during the term of this Agreement and any renewals, Contractor shall pay its 'Covered Employees', as defined in the Wage Ordinance, no less than the Alachua County Government Minimum Wage ("Minimum Wage"), as may be amended by the County. Contractor will require the same of its subcontractors and subconsultants who provide the Services. If applicable to the Services, Contractor will certify this understanding, obligation, and commitment to County through a certification, a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit "4". Contractor will (a) post a copy of the Minimum Wage Rate in a prominent place of its principal place of business where it is easily seen by Covered Employees; (b) supply a copy to any Covered Employee upon request; (c) make any person submitting a bid for a subcontract for Covered Services aware of these requirements; and (d) include the necessary provisions in subcontracts to ensure compliance. The County shall not be deemed a necessary, or indispensable, party in any litigation between Contractor and subcontractor. At this time of execution of this Agreement, the prevailing Minimum Wage is as follows, which is subject to change during the term of this Agreement, and will be updated, and be applicable, without the necessary of amendment to this Agreement:

\$18.00 per hour with qualifying health benefits amounting to at least \$2.00 per hour without health benefits

If applicable to the Services under this Agreement and to Contractor, the failure to comply with the provisions of the Wage Ordinance will be deemed a breach this Agreement and County is authorized to withhold payment of funds in accordance with Alachua County Code and Chapter 218, Florida Statutes.

12. <u>Default and Termination</u>.

- A. Termination for Default: The failure of Contractor to comply with any provision of this Agreement will place Contractor in default. If Contractor is in default or fails to perform in accordance with the terms or conditions of this Agreement, the County may provide a written notice of default. The County Manager and his/her designee is authorized to provide notice of default on behalf of County and notice may be sent electronically. If the default is not corrected within the allotted time as specifically provided in the notice of default, the County Manager is authorized to provide Contractor with written notice of termination of this Agreement on behalf of County. The effective date of termination of this Agreement will be the date specified in the notice of termination or, if no date is specified in the notice, then the effective date of termination will be the date that the notice of termination is received by the Contractor.
- B. <u>Termination for Convenience</u>: County may terminate the Agreement without cause by providing written notice of termination for convenience to the Contractor. County Manager and his/her designee is authorized to provide notice of termination on behalf of the County. Notice may be electronically given. Upon such notice, Contractor will immediately discontinue

- all Services for the County currently or to be provided to the County, unless the notice from the County directs otherwise. The effective date of termination of this Agreement will be the date specified in the notice of termination or, if not date specified in the notice, then the effective date of termination will be the date that the notice of termination is received by Contractor. In the event of termination, Contractor's recovery against County shall be limited to that portion of this Agreement amount earned through the date of termination. Contractor shall not be entitled to any other or further recovery against County, including, but not limited to, general damages, , or any anticipated fees or profit on portions of the Services not performed.
- C. Termination for Unavailability of Funding: If funds to finance this Agreement become unavailable, as determined by the County, County may terminate this Agreement upon written notice to Contractor. County Manager and his/her designee is authorized to provide notice of termination on behalf of the County. Notice may be electronically given. The effective date of termination of this Agreement will be the date specified in the notice of termination or, if not date specified in the notice, then the effective date of termination will be the date that the notice of termination is received by the Contractor.
- D. Upon termination of this Agreement based upon the above, the County may obtain the Services from any other sources, firms, and individuals, and may use any method deemed in the County's best interest. Upon termination, Contractor will deliver to County all data, drawings, specifications, reports, estimates, summaries, and other records as may have been accumulated by Contractor in performing this Agreement, whether completed or in draft.
- Indemnification. CONTRACTOR HEREBY WAIVES AND RELEASES, AND AGREES 13. TO PROTECT, DEFEND, INDEMNIFY AND HOLD HARMLESS ALACHUA COUNTY AND ITS BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, OFFICERS, EMPLOYEES, VOLUNTEERS, AND ATTORNEYS (COLLECTIVELY "ALACHUA COUNTY") FROM AND AGAINST ANY AND ALL CLAIMS, DEMANDS, PENALTIES, EXPENSES, AND CAUSES OF ACTION OF ANY AND EVERY DESCRIPTION, AND DAMAGES, INCLUDING ATTORNEYS' FEES AND COSTS, BROUGHT AGAINST ALACHUA COUNTY RESULTING FROM ANY ACCIDENT, INCIDENT OR OCCURRENCE ARISING OUT OF OR IN CONNECTION WITH AN ACT, ERROR OR OMISSION OF CONTRACTOR OR CONTRACTOR'S EMPLOYEES, OFFICERS, AGENTS, ASSIGNS OR SUBCONTRACTORS IN CONNECTION WITH THE PERFORMANCE OF THE SERVICES SET FORTH IN THIS AGREEMENT, INCLUDING ATTACHED EXHIBITS, OR FROM CONTRACTOR'S ENTRY ONTO ALACHUA COUNTY'S PROPERTY AND ANY AND ALL IMPROVEMENTS THEREON. This obligation shall in no way be limited in any nature by any limitation on the amount or type of Contractor's insurance coverage. In the event the County is alleged to be liable on account of alleged acts or omissions, or both, of Contractor or Contractor's employees, representatives or agents, then Contractor will investigate, respond to and provide a defense for any allegations and claims, at Contractor's sole costs and expense. Furthermore, Contractor will pay all costs, fees and other expenses of any defense, including but not limited to, all attorneys' fees, court costs and expert witness fees and expenses. . In the event Contractor and County are both named as defendants in any civil action or claim alleging a cause of action against both, then County will be responsible for the costs associated with the investigation of, responding to and providing a defense for any allegations and claims against the County, its employees and agents. The County shall be solely responsible for the cost of investigation, responding to, and defending all claims arising from the conduct of its employees and nothing in this paragraph shall result in the Contractor being liable for the investigation, responding to or defending claims arising from the conduct of the employees of the County or any other contractor that is not a party to this agreement. Contractor and County will jointly cooperate with each other in the event of any litigation, including any request for documentation. This indemnification provision will survive the termination of this Agreement. Nothing contained herein shall constitute a waiver by the County of sovereign immunity or the provisions or limitation of liability of §768.28, Florida Statutes, as may be

amended.

14. Notice. Except as otherwise provided in this Agreement, any notice from either Party to the other Party must be in writing and delivered by hand delivery with receipt or sent by certified mail, return receipt requested, to the addresses below. All notices will be deemed delivered five (5) business days after mailing. Each Party may change its mailing address by giving the other Party, written notice of election to change the address.

15. Human Trafficking Affidavit of No Coercion for Labor or Services

- A. Section 787.06(13), Florida Statutes, requires any governmental entity, which includes "district", when executing, renewing, or extending a contract, must obtain an affidavit from the non-governmental entity attesting that it does not use coercion for labor or services. The terms "coercion" and "labor" are defined respectively in sections 787.06(2)(a) 1-72 and 787.06(2)(e)3, Florida Statutes.
- B. Contractor will certify this understanding, obligation, through the completion of the No Coercion for Labor or Services Affidavit, a copy of which is attached the this Amendment as **Exhibit** "6"

16. Contracting with Entities of Foreign Countries of Concern Prohibited

- A. Section 287.138, Florida Statutes, prohibits any governmental entity, which includes "district", from contracting with entities of foreign countries of concern if the contract provides the vendor with access to an individual's personal identifying information and:
 - 16.A.1. The entity is owned by the government of a foreign country of concern;
 - 16.A.2. The government of a foreign country of concern has a controlling interest in the entity; or
 - 16.A.3. The entity is organized under the laws of or has its principal place of business in a foreign country of concern.
- B. The statute identifies foreign countries of concern as: The People's Republic of China, the Russian Federation, the Islamic Republic of Iran, the Democratic People's Republic of Korea, the Republic of Cuba, the Venezuelan regime of Nicolas Maduro, or the Syrian Arab Republic does not have a controlling interest in the Supplier.

C. Contractor will certify this understanding, obligation, through the completion of the Foreign Country of Concern Affidavit, a copy of which is attached this Amendment as **Exhibit "7"**

17. Standard Clauses.

- A. <u>Public Records</u>. In accordance with §119.0701, Florida Statutes, Contractor, when acting on behalf of the County, shall, as required by Florida law:
 - 1. Keep and maintain public records required by the County to perform the Services.
 - 2. Upon request from the County's custodian of public records, provide the County with a copy of the requested records or allow the records to be inspected or copied within a reasonable time at a cost that does not exceed the cost provided in Florida law or as otherwise provided by law.
 - 3. Ensure that public records that are exempt or confidential and exempt from public records disclosure requirements are not disclosed except as authorized by law for the duration of the term of this Agreement and following completion of the Agreement if Contractor does not transfer the records to the County.
 - 4. Upon completion of the Agreement, transfer, at no cost, to the County all public records in possession of Contractor or keep and maintain public records required by the County to perform the Services. If Contractor transfers all public records to the County upon completion of the Agreement, Contractor shall destroy any duplicate public records that are exempt or confidential and exempt from public records disclosure requirements. If Contractor keeps and maintains public records upon completion of the Agreement, Contractor shall meet all applicable requirements for retaining public records. All records stored electronically must be provided to the County, upon request from the County's custodian of public records, in a format that is compatible with the County's information technology systems.

IF CONTRACTOR HAS QUESTIONS REGARDING THE APPLICATION OF CHAPTER 119, FLORIDA STATUTES, TO CONTRACTOR'S DUTY TO PROVIDE PUBLIC RECORDS RELATING TO THIS CONTRACT, CONTACT THE COUNTY'S PUBLIC RECORDS CUSTODIAN AT publicrecordsrequest@alachuacounty.us OR (352) 264-6906 OR 12 SE 1ST STREET, GAINESVILLE, FL 32601.

If Contractor fails to comply with this section, Contractor will be deemed in default under this Agreement. The County may enforce as set forth in §119.0701, Florida Statutes. Contractor who fails to provide the public records in response to a request within a reasonable time may be subject to penalties imposed under §119.10, Florida Statute, and costs of enforcement, including fees, under §119.0701 and §119.12, Florida Statutes.

Contractor will take reasonable measures to protect, secure and maintain any data held by Contractor in an electronic form that is or contains exempt, confidential, personal information or protected information, as defined by Florida or federal law, related to or in connection with performance of the Services. If Contractor suspects or becomes aware of a security breach or unauthorized access to such data by a third party, Contractor shall immediately notify the County in writing and will work, at Contractor's expense, to prevent or stop the data breach.

B. <u>Confidential Information</u>. During the term of this Agreement, Contractor may claim that some of Contractor's information, including, but not limited to, software documentation, manuals, written methodologies and processes, pricing, discounts, or other considerations (hereafter collectively referred to as "Confidential Information"), is, or has been treated as confidential and proprietary by Contractor in accordance with §812.081, Florida Statutes, or other law, and is exempt from disclosure under the Florida's

public record laws. Contractor shall clearly identify and mark Confidential Information as "Confidential Information" or "CI" and the County shall use reasonable efforts to maintain the confidentiality of the Confidential Information that is clearly identified by Contractor. County will promptly notify Contractor in writing if the County receives a request for disclosure of Contractor's Confidential Information. Contractor may assert any exemption from disclosure available under applicable law or seek a protective order against disclosure from a court of competent jurisdiction. Contractor shall protect, defend, indemnify, and hold harmless Alachua County and its commissioners, officers and employees from and against any claims, actions and judgments arising out of a request for disclosure of Confidential Information or relating to violation or infringement of trademark, copyright patent, trade secret or intellectual property right; however, the foregoing obligation shall not apply to County's misuse or modification of Contractor's Confidential Information in a manner not contemplated by this Agreement. Contractor shall investigate, handle, respond to, and defend, at Contractor's sole cost and expense, any such claim, even if any such claim is groundless, false, or fraudulent. Contractor shall pay for all costs and expenses related to such claim, including, but not limited to, payment of attorneys' fees, costs and expenses. If Contractor is not reasonably able to modify or otherwise secure for the County the right to continue using the good or product, Contractor shall remove the product and refund the County the amounts paid in excess of a reasonable rental for past use. Upon completion of this Agreement, the provisions of this paragraph shall continue to survive. Contractor releases the County from claims or damages related to disclosure by the County.

- Auditing Rights and Information. County reserves the right to require the Contractor to C. submit to an audit, by any auditor of the County's choosing. Contractor shall provide access to all of its records, which relate directly or indirectly to this Agreement at its place of business during regular business hours. Contractor shall retain all records pertaining to this Agreement and upon request make them available to County for three (3) complete calendar years following expiration or termination of the Agreement. Contractor agrees to provide such assistance as may be necessary to facilitate the review or audit by the County to ensure compliance with applicable accounting and financial standards. If an audit inspection or examination pursuant to this section discloses overpricing or overcharges of any nature by the Contractor to the County, Contractor shall pay to County the Overcharged Amount which is defined as the total aggregate overcharged amount together with interest thereon (such interest to be established at the rate of 12% annum). Any adjustments or payments which must be made as a result of any such audit or inspection of the Contractor's invoices or records must be made. If the Overcharged Amount is equal to or greater than \$50,000.00, Contractor shall pay to County the Overcharged Amount and the Audit Amount which is defined as the total aggregate of County's reasonable audit costs incurred as a result of its audit of Contractor. County may recover the Overcharged Amount and the Audit Amount, as applicable, from any amount due or owing to Contractor whether under this Agreement and any other agreement between Contractor and County. If such amounts owed to Contractor are insufficient to cover the Overcharged Amount and Audit Amount, as applicable, then Contractor hereby shall pay such remaining amounts to County. Payment is due within a reasonable amount of time, but in no event may the time exceed sixty (60) calendar days, from presentation of the County's audit findings to Contractor. In no event shall the Overcharged Amount or the Audit Amount be deemed a reimbursable cost of the work or Services. This provision is hereby considered to be included within, and applicable to, any subcontractor agreement entered into by the Contractor in performance of the Services under this Agreement. The access, inspection, copying and auditing rights shall survive the termination of this Agreement.
- D. <u>Laws & Regulations</u>. Contractor will comply with all federal, state, and local laws, ordinances, regulations, rules and code requirements applicable to the work required by this Agreement. Contractor is presumed to be familiar with all laws, ordinances, regulations, and rules that may in any way affect the work outlined in this Agreement. If Contractor is not familiar with laws, ordinances, rules and regulations, Contractor remains liable for any violation and all subsequent damages, penalties, or fines.
- E. <u>Governing Law and Venue</u>. The laws of the State of Florida shall govern this Agreement and the duties and obligations stated within this Agreement. Sole and exclusive venue for all actions arising under this Agreement shall be in a court of competent jurisdiction in and for Alachua County, Florida.

- F. <u>Amendment and Assignment</u>. The Parties may only modify or amend this Agreement by a mutual written agreement of the Parties. Neither Party will assign or transfer any interest in this Agreement without prior written consent of the other Party. The County and Contractor each bind the other and their respective successors and assigns in all respects to all of the terms, conditions, covenants, and provisions of this Agreement.
- G. <u>Additional Services</u>. Additional services not specifically identified in this Agreement may be added to the Agreement upon execution of a written amendment by the Parties.
- H. <u>Third Party Beneficiaries</u>. This Agreement does not create any relationship with, or any rights in favor of, any third party.
- I. <u>Independent Contractor</u>. In the performance of this Agreement, Contractor is acting in the capacity of an independent contractor and not as an agent, employee, partner, joint venturer, or associate of the County. Contractor is solely responsible for the means, method, technique, sequence, and procedure utilized by Contractor in the full performance of the Services referenced in this Agreement.
- J. <u>E-Verify</u>. Pursuant to F.S. §448.095, Contractor shall register and use the U.S. Department of Homeland Security's E-Verify system to verify the work authorization status of all new employees hired by the Contractor during the term of the Agreement. Contractor shall expressly require any subcontractors performing work or providing Services under this Agreement to utilize the U.S. Department of Homeland Security's E-Verify system to verify the employment eligibility of all new employees hired by the subcontractor during the term of this Agreement. The E-Verify system is located at https://www.uscis.gov/E-Verify. Failure to comply with this section is grounds for termination and the Contractor (a) may not be awarded a public contract for at least 1 year after the date on which this Agreement was terminated and (b) Contractor is liable for any additional costs incurred by the County as a result of termination of this Agreement.
- K. <u>Conflict of Interest</u>. Contractor warrants that neither Contractor nor any of Contractor's employees have any financial or personal interest that conflicts with the execution of this Agreement. The Contractor shall notify County of any conflict of interest due to any other clients, contracts, or property interests.
- L. <u>Prohibition Against Contingent Fees</u>. As required by §287.055(6), Florida Statutes, the Contractor warrants that he or she has not employed or retained any company or person, other than a bona fide employee working solely for the Contractor to solicit or secure this Agreement and that he or she has not paid or agreed to pay any person, company, corporation, individual, or firm, other than a bona fide employee working solely for the Contractor any fee, commission, percentage, gift, or other consideration contingent upon or resulting from the award or making of this Agreement. If Contractor breaches this provision, the County has the right to termination this Agreement without liability, and at the County's discretion, to deduct from the contract price, or otherwise recover, the full amount of such fee, commission, percentage, gift or consideration.
- M. <u>Force Majeure</u>. The Parties will exercise every reasonable effort to meet their respective duties under this Agreement but will not be liable for delays resulting from force majeure or other causes beyond their reasonable control, including, but not limited to, compliance with any government laws or regulation, acts of nature, fires, strikes, national disasters, wars, riots, transportation problems and any other cause whatsoever beyond the reasonable control of the Parties. Any such cause will reasonably extend the performance of the delayed duty to the extent of the delay so incurred and so agreed by the Parties.
- N. <u>Public Entity Crimes</u>. A person or affiliate who has been placed on the convicted vendor list following a conviction of a public entity crime may not be awarded or perform work as a contractor, supplier, subcontractor, or consultant under a contract with any public entity in excess of the threshold amount provided in Florida Statutes, Section 287.017 for Category Two for a period of thirty-six (36) months from the date of being placed on the convicted vendor list.
- O. <u>Collusion</u>. By signing this Agreement, Contractor declares that this Agreement is made without any previous understanding, agreement, or connections with any persons, contractors or corporations and that this Agreement is fair, and made in good faith without any outside control, collusion, or fraud.

- P. <u>Counterparts</u>. This Agreement may be executed in any number of and by the different Parties hereto on separate counterparts, each of which when so executed shall be deemed to be an original, and such counterparts shall together constitute but one and the same instrument. Receipt via email with pdf attachment by a party or its designated legal counsel of an executed counterpart of this Amendment shall constitute valid and sufficient delivery in order to complete execution and delivery of this Amendment and bind the Parties to the terms hereof.
- Q. Severability and Ambiguity. It is understood and agreed by the Parties that if any of the provisions of the Agreement shall contravene or be invalid under the laws of the State of Florida, such contravention or invalidity shall not invalidate the entire Agreement, but it shall be construed as if not containing the particular provision(s) held to be invalid, and the rights and obligations of the Parties shall be construed and enforced accordingly. This Agreement shall not be construed more strictly against one Party than against the other Party, merely due to fact that it may have been prepared by one of the Parties. Each Party represents and agrees that it has had the opportunity to seek the advice of appropriate professionals, including legal counsel, in the review and execution of this Agreement.
- R. <u>Electronic Signatures</u>. The Parties agree that an electronic version of this Agreement shall have the same legal effect and enforceability as a paper version. The Parties further agree that this Agreement, regardless of whether in electronic or paper form, may be executed by use of electronic signatures. Electronic signatures shall have the same legal effect and enforceability as manually written signatures. Delivery of this Agreement or any other document contemplated hereby bearing an manually written or electronic signature, by electronic mail in "portable document format" (".pdf") form, or by any other electronic means intended to preserve the original graphic and pictorial appearance of a document, will have the same effect as physical delivery of the paper document bearing an original or electronic signature.
- S. <u>Entire Agreement</u>. This Agreement constitutes the entire Agreement and supersedes all prior written or oral agreements, understandings, or representations of the Parties.

Exhibit 1: Scope of Services/Work

1. General Requirements:

- 1.1. The Contractor shall provide Dash Cameras Installation and Services for Fleet Vehicles owned and operated by the County.
- 1.2. The Contractor shall dash camera systems, installation and training in order to enhance safety and security for government vehicle operators and passengers, improve accountability and transparency in government vehicle operations, provide reliable evidence for accident investigation and resolution of disputes and to ensure compliance with regulatory requirements and best practices in fleet management.
- 1.3. The County intends to phase this project with new installations every year, until all County managed vehicles are equipped in dash cameras. The contractor shall maintain open communication with the County regarding the phases and tasks of this project. The County owns approximately 350 vehicles including ambulances, trucks, semi-tractor trailers, passenger vehicles and others. The County reserves the right to add and delete vehicles.
- 1.4. The Contractor shall provide equipment and installation required per the following categories:
 - 1.4.1. Automotive and Light Trucks
 - 1.4.2. Medium and Heavy Straight Trucks (Wide Angle Cameras)
 - 1.4.3. Ambulances (Wide Angle Cameras)
 - 1.4.4. Fire Trucks (Wide Angle Cameras)
 - 1.4.5. Semi-tractor Trailers and Trucks (Wide Angle-Cameras)
- 1.5. The Contractor shall maintain knowledge of all applicable industry standards, laws, and regulations and possess an ability to distribute and install the equipment, products, or services. Including, but not limited to:
 - 1.5.1. Safety Requirements. All items proposed must comply with current applicable safety or regulatory standards or codes.
 - 1.5.2. Deviation from Industry Standard. Deviations from industry standards must be identified with an explanation of how the equipment, products, and services will provide equivalent function, coverage, performance, and/or related services.
 - 1.5.3. Delivered and operational. Unless approved by the County, equipment and products must be delivered to the Participating Entity as operational.
 - 1.5.4. Warranty. All equipment, products, supplies, and services must be covered by a warranty that is the industry standard or better.

2. Specific Requirements

- 2.1. The scope of work for this project shall include, but not be limited to, the following:
 - 2.1.1. Supply and installation of front-facing, rear view, and driver facing cameras, in government vehicles, including in-cab screen.
 - 2.1.2. Supply and install Wide Angle Cameras on specified commercial County vehicles.
 - 2.1.3. Integration of dash cameras with existing vehicle systems (if applicable).

- 2.1.4. Provision of necessary mounting hardware and accessories.
- 2.1.5. Conducting installation services at designated government facilities.
- 2.1.6. Providing comprehensive training sessions for government personnel on the installation, operation, maintenance, and retrieval of footage from the dash cameras.
- 2.1.7. Offering ongoing technical support and maintenance services throughout the contract period.
- 3. Technical Requirements
 - 3.1. The technical requirements for this project shall include, but not be limited to, the following:
 - 3.1.1. High-definition (HD) resolution for clear and detailed footage.
 - 3.1.2. Wide-angle lenses for maximum coverage.
 - 3.1.3. GPS tracking capabilities for location monitoring.
 - 3.1.4. Loop recording functionality to ensure continuous recording. Proposers must ensure that videos are kept on file and accessible for a minimum of thirty (30) days.
 - 3.1.5. G-force sensors for automatic event detection and recording.
 - 3.1.6. Compatibility with existing fleet management systems (if applicable).
 - 3.1.7. Secure storage options to protect recorded footage from tampering or unauthorized access. Cloud based software is preferred.
 - 3.2. The Contractor shall provide a reliable, scalable, flexible web-based SaaS solution to help manage and track vehicles. This solution should also comply with video retention requirements set forth in the Florida Statutes.
 - 3.2.1. On-Board Software must retain videos for a minimum for thirty (30) days, in accordance with Florida Statute 119.
 - 3.3. The Contractor should hold sales, services and warranty of all products provided.
