1. Provide a summary of the proposed ordinance (must include a statement of the public purpose, such as serving the public health, safety, morals and welfare):

The proposed ordinance will revise existing sections of the County's ULDC related to street design. It will support implementation of policies related to multi modal transportation in the Future Land Use, Transportation Mobility, and Capital Improvement Elements of the Alachua County Comprehensive Plan.

The public purposes as stated in the proposed ordinance are:

- (a) Improve public safety and welfare by providing enhanced bicycle and pedestrian facilities that align with State and National standards.
- (b) Calm traffic and increase the comfort and safety of all road users with proven safety countermeasures.
- (c) Improve efficient use of Right of Way and resources by creating context sensitive typical sections.
- (d) Support vibrant TOD/TND communities and place making through human-scale design.
- (e) Enhance the county tree canopy by accommodating recent updates to the landscape code.

The proposed ordinance only applies to applications for new development plans with roadways. Therefore the number of businesses likely to be impacted is dependent on the number of development plan applications with new roadways submitted to the County. Base on this, it is estimated that approximately 10-20 businesses could likely be impacted annually
