NOVATION AND SECOND AMENDMENT TO AGREEMENT FOR ANNUAL SUBSURFACE INJECTION AND GROUT SERVICES FOR THE COUNTY WITH UNITED STRUCTURAL SYSTEMS, LLC DBA FOUNDATION SERVICES OF CENTRAL FLORIDA NO. (#)13701

THIS NOVATION AND SECOND AMENDMENT ("Second Amendment") is made by and between Alachua County, Florida, a political subdivision and charter county of the State of Florida, by and through its Board of County Commissioners (the "County") and United Structural Systems, LLC, a Foreign member-managed limited liability corporation which is authorized to do business in the State of Florida, as successor to Foundation Services of Central Florida, Inc., hereinafter referred to as the "Assignee" or "Contractor". Collectively the County and the Assignee are referred to as the "Parties".

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the County and Foundation Services of Central Florida, Inc. previously entered into a Continuing Services Agreement, dated 03/08/2023, for Annual Subsurface Injection and Grout Services for the County, identified by No. 13701 (the "Agreement"); and

WHEREAS, the Assignee represent and warrants to the County that Foundation Services of Central Florida, Inc. merged with United Structural Systems, LLC, on 4/10/2025, with United Structural Systems, LLC being the surviving entity; and

WHEREAS, the Assignee represents and warrants to the County that Foundation Services of Central Florida, Inc. has assigned and novated, transferred and conveyed to United Structural Systems, LLC all of its rights, title, interests, duties, obligations, responsibilities and liabilities for, in and related to the Agreement, and United Structural Systems, LLC has accepted the assignment and novation, transfer and conveyance, and agrees to assume all of Foundation Services of Central Florida, Inc. rights, titles, interests, duties, obligations, responsibilities and liabilities for, in and related to the Agreement; and

WHEREAS, based on the above recited representations and warranties made by the Assignee to the County, the County consents to the assignment and novation from Assignor to Assignee of all rights, title, interests, duties, obligations, responsibilities and liabilities for, in and related to the Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the County has elected its final option to renew the term of the original Agreement to allow the Contractor to furnish the goods or service to Alachua County; and

WHEREAS, the Parties agree to amend the Agreement to incorporate the statutory language and affidavit required by Section 787.06(13), Florida Statutes, No Coercion for Labor or Services; and

WHEREAS, the Parties agree to amend the Agreement to incorporate the statutory language and affidavit required by Section 287.138, Florida Statutes, Contracting with Entities of Foreign Countries of Concern Prohibited; and

WHEREAS, the Parties desires to amend the Agreement to extend the term and to do as otherwise provided herein.

- **NOW, THEREFORE**, in consideration of the foregoing recitals, which are incorporated by reference and shall be deemed an integral part of this Second Amendment, and in consideration of the mutual covenants and promises contained herein and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the Parties agree to amend the Agreement as follows:
- A. <u>Amendment</u>. The recitals above are true and correct and incorporated herein. Foundation Services of Central Florida, Inc. merged with United Structural Systems, LLC on 4/10/2025, with United Structural Systems, LLC being the surviving entity, and United Structural Systems, LLC agrees to assume all of Foundation Services of Central Florida, Inc. rights, titles, interests, duties, obligations, responsibilities and

liabilities for, in and related to the Agreement. The County consents to United Structural Systems, LLC assumption and agrees to be bound in all respects by the terms of the Agreement. Accordingly, all references to Foundation Services of Central Florida, Inc. as shown in the Agreement is hereby amended to be United Structural Systems, LLC and with all addresses and identified Points of Contact remaining the same. Assignee represents and warrants to the County that it is a member-managed limited liability corporation, and the undersigned is authorized to execute this Amendment on behalf of the Contractor.

- B. <u>Amendment</u>. Section 3, of the Agreement titled "Term" is amended to read as follows:
 - 3. <u>Term.</u> This Agreement is effective upon execution by both Parties ("Effective Date") and continues through September 30, 2027, unless earlier terminated as provided herein.
- C. <u>Amendment</u>. The Agreement is amended to add new sub-Section 15-T titled "Affidavit of No Coercion Pursuant to \$787.06, Florida Statutes" as follows:
 - 15.T. Affidavit of No Coercion Pursuant to §787.06, Florida Statutes.
 - 1. Section 787.06(13), Florida Statutes, requires any governmental entity, when executing, renewing, or extending a contract, must obtain an affidavit from the non-governmental entity attesting that it does not use coercion for labor or services. The terms "coercion" and "labor" are defined respectively in sections 787.06(2)(a) and 787.06(2)(e), Florida Statutes.
 - 2. The Contractor will certify its compliance with this statutory requirement by completing and executing the Affidavit of No Coercion for Pursuant to §787.06, Florida Statutes, a copy of which is attached to this Second Amendment as **Exhibit 5.**
- D. <u>Amendment</u>. The Agreement is amended to add new sub-Section 15-U titled "Contracting with Entities of Foreign Countries of Concern Prohibited" is added to the Agreement to read as follows:
 - 15.U. <u>Contracting with Entities of Foreign Countries of Concern Prohibited</u>
 - 1. Section 287.138, Florida Statutes, prohibits any governmental entity from contracting with an entity if the contract provides the entity with access to an individual's personal identifying information and:
 - a. The entity is owned by the government of a foreign country of concern;
 - b. The government of a foreign country of concern has a controlling interest in the entity; or
 - c. The entity is organized under the laws of or has its principal place of business in a foreign country of concern.
 - 2. The statute identifies foreign countries of concern as: The People's Republic of China, the Russian Federation, the Islamic Republic of Iran, the Democratic People's Republic of Korea, the Republic of Cuba, the Venezuelan regime of Nicolas Maduro, or the Syrian Arab Republic, including any agency of or any other entity of significant control of such foreign country of concern.
 - 3. The Contractor will certify its compliance with this statutory requirements by completing and executing the Affidavit Regarding Foreign Countries of Concern, a copy of which is attached to this Second Agreement as **Exhibit 6.**
- E. Effective Date. This Second Amendment is effective upon execution by both Parties.
- F. <u>Original Agreement</u>. Unless expressly amended herein, all other terms and provisions of the Agreement, including any prior amendments to the Agreement, shall be and remain in full force and effect. In the event any of the prior amendments to the Agreement conflict with this Second Amendment, the provisions of this Second Amendment shall prevail.
