

FIRST AMENDMENT TO AGREEMENT ON MEDICAL CARE CLAIMS ALACHUA AND WELLPATH, NO. 13331

THIS AMENDMENT (“Amendment”) is made by and between Alachua County, Florida, a political subdivision and charter county of the State of Florida, by and through its Board of County Commissioners (the “County”) and Wellpath LLC, a Foreign Limited Liability Corporation which is authorized to do business in the State of Florida (“Wellpath”), who are collectively referred to as the “Parties”.

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the Parties previously entered into an Agreement, dated March 10, 2022, for Medical Carew Claims, identified by No. 13331 (the “Agreement”); and

WHEREAS, the County has elected its option to renew the term of the Agreement to allow the Contractor to furnish the goods or service to Alachua County; and

WHEREAS, the Parties agree to amend the Agreement to incorporate the statutory language and affidavit required by Section 787.06(13), Florida Statutes, No Coercion for Labor or Services, to the original Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the Parties agree to amend the Agreement to incorporate the statutory language and affidavit required by Section 287.138, Florida Statutes, Contracting with Entities of Foreign Countries of Concern Prohibited, to the original Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the Parties desires to amend the Agreement to extend the term and to do as otherwise provided herein.

NOW, THEREFORE, the County and Contractor agree to amend the Agreement as follows:

A. Amendment. Section #6, of the Agreement titled “Effective date, Term, and Renewal” is amended to read as follows:

The term of this Agreement shall commence on February 1, 2022 (the "Commencement Date") and shall run through September 30, 2026 (the "Contract Term") unless earlier terminated in accordance with this Agreement. This Agreement may be renewed for one (1) additional one-year terms thereafter upon written mutual agreement of the parties. The aforementioned renewal period, if approved, shall be as follows:

Renewal Period: October 1, 2026, through September 30, 2027

B. Amendment. The Agreement is amended to add new Section 14, titled “Affidavit of No Coercion Pursuant to §787.06, Florida Statutes” to read as follows:

14. Affidavit of No Coercion Pursuant to §787.06, Florida Statutes

14.1. Section 787.06(13), Florida Statutes, requires any governmental entity when executing, renewing, or extending a contract, must obtain an affidavit from the non-governmental entity attesting

that it does not use coercion for labor or services. The terms "coercion" and "labor" are defined respectively in sections 787.06(2)(a) and 787.06(2)(e), Florida Statutes.

14.2. The Professional will comply with this statutory requirement by completing and executing the Affidavit of No Coercion Pursuant to §787.06, Florida Statutes, a copy of which is attached to the First Amendment as **Exhibit C**.

C. Amendment. The Agreement is amended to add new Section 15, titled "Contracting with Entities of Foreign Countries of Concern Prohibited" to read as follows:

15. Contracting with Entities of Foreign Countries of Concern Prohibited

1. Section 287.138, Florida Statutes, prohibits any governmental entity from contracting with an entity if the contract provides the entity with access to an individual's personal identifying information and:

- a. The entity is owned by the government of a foreign country of concern;
- b. The government of a foreign country of concern has a controlling interest in the entity; or
- c. The entity is organized under the laws of or has its principal place of business in a foreign country of concern.

2. The statute identifies foreign countries of concern as: The People's Republic of China, the Russian Federation, the Islamic Republic of Iran, the Democratic People's Republic of Korea, the Republic of Cuba, the Venezuelan regime of Nicolas Maduro, or the Syrian Arab Republic, including any agency of or any other entity of significant control of such foreign county of concern

3. The Professional will comply with this statutory requirement by completing and executing the Affidavit Regarding Foreign Countries of Concern, a copy of which is attached to the First Amendment as Exhibit D.

D. Effective Date. This Amendment shall become effective upon execution by both Parties.

E. Original Agreement. Unless expressly amended herein, all other terms and provisions of the Agreement shall be and remain in full force and effect. In the event any of the prior amendments to the Agreement conflict with this Amendment, the provisions of this Amendment shall prevail.

F. Signature Authority. Contractor represents and warrants to the County that the undersigned is authorized to execute this Amendment on behalf of the Contractor.
