The only attendee from the public was Mr. Dave Boeff, President/CEO of NexTower, a local tower development company. A summary of Mr. Boeff's comments are shown below

- He has built many towers within Alachua Co. and the Jacksonville area.
- Additional requirements for towers (such as minimum acreage requirements) may eliminate many potential sites.
- Current monopole or concealed towers may not be adequate to accommodate the full bulk of the equipment needed for 5G. Only "5G-lite" may be possible.
- There is a trade-off between the capacity a tower can hold versus the coverage it can provide.
- County should look at how County property could be used for new PWSF and the process used to get a tower developer to build it (RFP has problems).
- Look at "lampshade" tower design that can hold bulkier equipment and help dissipate heat buildup.

A virtual-only public workshop was held the following day, March 28th at 6pm. However, no one from the public attended. At 6:30pm staff ended the meeting.
